SUMMARY

This amendment would expand the existing MassHousing Septic Repair Loan Program (SRLP) to enable low-income homeowners across Massachusetts to access no- or low-interest loans to remediate contaminated private wells.

Approximately \$3 million still remains in the SRLP revolving loan fund, so **no additional state funding is required** at this time.

Currently, there are few financial assistance programs for the >500,000 Massachusetts residents relying on private wells for drinking water.

CONTAMINATED WELLS ARE PREVALENT

Recent testing programs suggest that:

- ~27% of private wells may have contaminants exceeding primary health standards and/or suggesting health risks
- ~5% of private wells may have PFAS exceeding state standards

CONTAMINANTS CAN HARM HEALTH

Arsenic, E. coli, PFAS, radon, uranium, etc. can have negative short- or long-term health impacts

TREATMENT SYSTEMS CAN BE COSTLY

Private well treatment systems can range from \$1,000 - \$10,000, which can be a financial burden, especially for lowincome homeowners
