## Support Clean Drinking Water – Call/Write Today!



We need your help to ensure that all Massachusetts residents have access to safe drinking water! Representative Dan Sena just filed **Amendment #5**, **Private Well Clean Up**, to H.5007, and we need your getting it across the finish line. We have asked for your support in the past, and we hope you will consider writing to your State Representative again (or for the first time).

Amendment #5, Private Well Clean Up, would expand the existing Septic Repair Loan Program to enable low-income private well owners to access no-/low-interest loans to remediate contaminated private wells. The loan program is administered by MassHousing, and \$3 million remains in the fund, so NO additional state funding is needed at this time.

Please join us in taking action by doing the following:

 Call or e-mail your State Representative this week asking for cosponsorship of Amendment #5 to H.5007. You can use language such as "I am contacting you today to ask for your support on an important amendment that would advance health equity and help low-income homeowners access safe drinking water. Please cosponsor Amendment #5 to H.5007 to ensure that all Massachusetts residents have access to safe drinking water regardless of where they live or what their financial resources are" and add a few sentences about why you care about safe drinking water and health equity.

Please don't delay! With the formal legislative session ending this month, H.5007 will move quickly, and we need your help so that Amendment #5 is adopted. The longer we wait, the longer many Massachusetts residents will continue drinking contaminated private well water because they cannot afford to install treatment systems that may cost \$1,000 - \$10,000. Currently, there are very few financial assistance options for low-income private well owners. Even if you do not rely on a private well, you probably have colleagues, friends, or relatives who do.

The Foundation has provided over \$1 million in funding to the <u>Private Well Program to Protect Public Health</u>, led by RCAP Solutions, since 2020.
